Thank you for leading the A-Squared Lamps program for writing during October and November, 2016. During that time, you led our group toward a common goal of writing 50,000 words or more. When I heard the goal, I didn't think it was going to be possible for me, especially with the heavy work-load I expected for October and November. However, you guided me through the program and helped me overcome some obstacles. You also provided some two books to help me plan my writing assignment. The authors for these books presented clear, easy to follow templates to help the user plan around describing the flow of the story; going deep into a detailed description of the character, the events in their lives as well as the twists and turns of the character as they progress through the story. On a personal basis, you suggested ways for me to fit my writing goals into the story when I was stumped on how to finish the story. I would have never been able to write this story without your help and inspiration.

You made the assignment fun. You had the group meet every Friday evening on the phone, and we took an hour (or so) to share the new adventures we found during the past week. In addition, you shared a lesson for us that you showed through an internet program. Your lessons were well-prepared and interesting. I looked forward to these weekly meeting. You gave me a platform to share the joys and frustrations of my writing. For example, researching and writing the story felt comfortable to me. I normally get up early, often before 5am. I got into a good habit of using this time to write; sometimes a thousand words, sometimes several thousand words. The words often-times flowed onto the screen. At other times, and especially on the weekends, my wife and I would travel to see family and drive to a church presentation. Because I needed time to write and/or organize the story, my wife, Marcia, would drive. I would set up the back seat to be my Toyota RAV4 with my 'traveling office' and I would spend the time busy with the story. As you can see, the writing assignment quickly involved both my wife and me.

Again, thank you for your leadership and teaching you gave me for writing this story. I recommend any others to your program if they want a way to write their story or their book.
